



Curatorial Internship Opening Summer 2026

Job Title: Getty Marrow Curatorial Intern

Hours: 40 hours/week for 10 weeks, Monday-Friday 8am-4:30pm

Compensation: \$7,400

Application Deadline: April 15, 2026

The Getty Marrow Undergraduate Curatorial Intern at Rancho Los Cerritos will have the opportunity to explore curatorial opportunities at a mid-size museum; to enhance research and communication skills; to acquire experience developing museum exhibits; and to work closely with volunteers and museum staff. The intern will also participate in Getty-sponsored seminars and trips.

Position Description:

Under the supervision of our Collections Manager, the Getty Marrow Curatorial Intern will work on researching and developing a small museum exhibit at Rancho Los Cerritos Historic Site as well as managing the site's collections. The intern will spend the summer actively learning about museum curation, exhibition research, design, and development as well participating in exhibition related programming and events. In addition, the Getty Marrow Curatorial Intern will take part in collections care and maintenance while also learning about museum collections management software. Through both curation and collections management, the intern will be immersed in practices that are firmly rooted in Rancho Los Cerritos' mission and embody the site's Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Accessibility (DEIA) goals. The intern will gain valuable insight into museum and nonprofit management. The intern will work full-time, forty hours a week, Monday through Friday 8am-4:30pm.

Eligibility & Qualifications:

Getty Marrow Undergraduate Interns must:

- **Be currently enrolled as full-time undergraduate.** (Bachelor's degree program or Associate degree program). Students must have completed at least one semester or two quarters of college by June 2026. Students who graduated after April 1, 2026, are also eligible. (Students who are enrolled in a second BA or BS program are not eligible.)
- **Reside or attend college in Los Angeles County.**
- **Be a United States citizen or permanent resident.** (Non-citizen authorized to live and work in the United States on a permanent basis; also known as a "green card" holder). Students with DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrival) status valid through the internship period are also eligible.

Candidates are not eligible if:

- They have previously served as Getty Marrow Undergraduate summer interns at our organization
- They have received a prior BA, BS, or higher degree

In addition to completing supervisor-assigned projects and tasks during the summer, Getty Marrow Undergraduate Interns must:

- Work full-time (no more than 40 hours a week, approx. 400 hours total), for 10 consecutive weeks between June and August
- Attend three mandatory Education Events: ✓ Arts Summit ✓ Two Learning Community events
- Submit an end-of internship evaluation.

Interested candidates should submit a resume, an academic writing sample no longer than 6 pages, and an academic letter of recommendation that describes their qualifications for the Getty Marrow Curatorial Internship position to Magdalena Cervantes, Collections Manager at MagdalenaC@RanchoLosCerritos.org.
